Dear Ms. Beaulieu,

The Alaska Native Health Board (ANHB)<sup>1</sup> supports the Department of Health (DOH) proposal to submit a state plan amendment (SPA) for the extension of temporary Public Health Emergency (PHE) related Service Authorizations (SA) for state plan behavioral health services, with an effective date of May 12, 2024.

We understand that DOH intends to create continuity between the temporary PHE SA suspensions, which expired on May 11, 2024, and the effective date of the forthcoming SPA and regulations to repeal certain SAs for state plan behavioral health services.

ANHB supports this intent and appreciates the ongoing collaboration with DOH to resolve the regulations' discrepancy, provide continuity for providers, and ultimately reduce the administrative burden of SA requirements for behavioral health services. Due to the time-sensitive nature of the proposed SPA, ANHB also supports DOH's request to conduct Tribal consultation concurrently with the approval process.
