

Why are we here today?





Building Systems Supporting Youth



- Many services and systems work together to support youth
- School-Based Services is one area of opportunity to support youth



School-Based Services



Medicaid can only reimburse for school-based services if:

- ☐ The student has a disability
- The services are included in the student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP)

Medicaid-reimbursable services include:

- Speech, Occupational, Physical Therapy
- > Audiology
- > Some nursing services
- > Behavioral Health Services



Only **6 out of 54** districts currently submit claims for Medicaid reimbursement.



SPARK Stakeholder Group

- New flexibilities for School-Based Services from CMS

New CMS Flexibilities for SBS



2023 CMS Guidance updating Medicaid-covered SBS

- Any Medicaid-eligible student able to receive reimbursable SBS
- Medicaid Agencies given options to streamline billing & reimbursement methods
- Schools can make administrative claims for time spent serving Medicaid-eligible students
- > CMS FAQ



Meeting the Child with Services





Districts that utilize Medicaid reimbursement can:

- Maximize Federal match when providing services
- Be reimbursed for services they already provide
- Participate in Random Moment Time Studies (RMTS) to begin using administrative claiming
- Utilize Plans of Care/Treatment when service is clinically appropriate, reduces the need for IEP team for non-IDEA students

Senate Bill 240

Introduced2/19/24

House Bill 343

Introduced2/20/24

- Both received hearings this week



Benefits to Alaskans



Families and Children

- ✓ Provides more convenient choices for parents seeking care for their children
- ✓ Increases access to services for children
- ✓ Promotes early intervention and prevention
- ✓ Provides services where the child is every day

System Efficiencies

- ✓ Allows schools to seek Medicaid reimbursement when a child is eligible
- ✓ Maximizes federal Medicaid match



CMS Grant Opportunity





State Medicaid Agencies are eligible for **\$2.5M** grant to support SBS

- Focus on implementation of SBS in Alaska
- Funds can be used to:
 - Streamline Medicaid-reimbursable services in current billing school districts
 - Assist school districts that want to begin billing for Medicaid-reimbursable services
