## The following revision has been made to RFP Section 1.13 Pre-Proposal Conference.

Two pre-proposal conferences are scheduled to discuss the work performed with the prospective offerors and allow them to ask questions concerning the RFP. Questions and answers will be transcribed and provided as an amendment to the solicitation as soon as possible following each meeting.

## Vendor Questions have been answered as follows:

Q1: Some potential bidders are health care organizations comprised of numerous subsidiary corporate entities with separate lines of business, organized under a common corporate parent entity. These include separate entities experienced in the business of care management and Medicaid managed care, respectively.

Section 1.01 of the RFP states "Each proposal submitted in response to this RFP must fit into one, and only one, of these models, and each offeror may submit only one proposal." However, the term "offeror" is not defined in the RFP.

In order to encourage proposal responses and competition for the State while soliciting the best possible selection of various health care models, are separate legal entities affiliated under the same corporate parent permitted to submit distinct responses proposing a different health care model, for example one proposing a Care Management Entity model and another a Managed Care Organization model?

A1: Yes. This is consistent with the intent of the RFP and would be allowed.

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
