1115 Waiver regulations effective February 2, 2024

DBH Provider,

Providers reporting crisis intervention follow up services (procedure codes H2011 TS V1 and/or H2011 TS V2) or certain procedure codes with place of service updates may experience a slight delay in claims payment to allow for manual processing until full Optum system configuration is complete. Optum is working diligently to implement all changes in their system.

- Individuals with a PSS in good standing (PSA, PSP1, PSP2, PSP3 And TPSA, TPS1, TPS2, TPS3)

<u>* On or after January 1, 2024, CDC 1 must include a copy of their bachelor's diploma per the</u> <u>certifying body's requirements.</u>

This error has been *removed* from the final version of SUD Provider Services Manual published on <u>Medicaid Provider Assistance Information</u> section of the <u>Division of Behavioral Health</u> (DBH) website.

DBH will align CDC requirements at all levels with the Alaska Commission for Behavioral Health Certification (ACBHC). Current guidance from the ACBHC is a bachelor's degree may be required for CDC 2 on or after January 1, 2026.
