#### Funding source- ARPA:

- Hire a contractor to review and improve the Child Care Assistance Program to make it more accessible and supportive for parents and providers which will inform strategies such as: \*\*\*
  - Support parents by covering the cost of co-payments (for a period to be determined)
  - Provide grants to families not typically covered by child care assistance including those utilizing non-traditional care hours and those ineligible due to income, this will be targeted to parents working in the first responder and/or medical fields
  - o Increase reimbursement rates to a higher percentile of market rate
  - Improve payment polices
  - Broaden eligibility to child care assistance
  - Update Family Income and Contribution Schedule
  - Provide contracted slots
  - Improve Child Care Grant Program & the Alaska IN! Program
- Pilot a tiered reimbursement initiative for infant and toddler care \*\*\*
- Provide financial aid for providers who were not participating in subsidy system prior to Covid-19 pandemic\*\*\*

### **INCREASE ACCESS TO LICENSED CARE \$45,336,010**

Funding source- ARPA:

- Phase 1 stabilization provides immediate relief to providers and collects information to inform future phases\*\*\*
  - Additional supports through bonuses provided for non-traditional care hours (designed to serve parents working in the first responder and/or medical fields), Learn & Grow participation, Child Care Assistance Program Participation, serving children with special needs, and serving infants and toddlers.
- Phase 2 stabilization helps providers reach their intended licensed capacity and return to stabilization\*\*\*
  - Additional supports through bonuses provided for participation in Learn & Grow and the Child Care Assistance Program
- Phase 3 contributes toward stabilizing licensed child care programs and supporting the ECE workforce
  - Additional support programs for developing workforce initiatives\*\*\*
  - o Included additional community-based grants and Workforce Initiative Opt-In

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### Funding source- CRRSA:

- Improve technology supporting health and safety\*
- Provide start up grants for underserved communities for increasing licensed child care slots \*\*\*
- Increase funding to support research and writing of regulation changes
- Provide funding to After School Network to increase School-Age supports and child care slots\*\*\*
- Support increased compliance for background check program\*\*
- Provide grant to increase infant/toddler slots\*\*\*
- Provide incentives for Head Start and Pre-K programs expanding to operate full day licensed child care \*\*
- Support families with special needs children to increase access to child care \*\*\*
