We want to thank and congratulate the Native Village of Kobuk of the July 2012 tribal meeting for supporting and passing of Resolution 2012-16: *Resolution for the Control and Elimination of Tobacco in the Work Place and Enclosed Public Places.*

Alaska Native people have taken the lead addressing health issues, yet there remains significant work to be done. Alaska Native people use tobacco at a higher rate than all other Alaskans and suffer the health consequences with heart disease, cancer and other serious conditions. A significant amount of tobacco use exposure for Alaska Native adults occurs in workplaces and even short exposures may result in adverse health effects and death.

Tobacco-free workplace laws protect Alaska Natives from secondhand smoke, reduce tobacco use overall, support healthy lifestyles, model policy behavior, and support quit attempts.

Your support of tobacco-free workplace policies for your tribe and community show leadership and commitment to the health and well-being of all people.
