Pregnancy-Associated Mortality in Alaska


The Alaska Maternal Child Death Review (MCDR) Committee reviews all deaths of women while pregnant or within one year of the end of pregnancy, due to any cause.


2012-2017 Update

Drug or alcohol overdose was the most common cause (27%) of the 56 Alaskan pregnancy-associated deaths that occurred 2012-2017.



Pregnancy-related deaths were 13% of all Alaskan pregnancy-associated deaths.

Alaska's 2012-2017 **pregnancy-related mortality rate** is lower than the most recent U.S. rate.

Additional MCDR Committee Findings

Among 54 pregnancy-associated deaths reviewed:

- **85%** (n=46) were *potentially preventable*.
- Mental health conditions contributed to 30%.

Drug or alcohol abuse or substance use disorders contributed to
52%.
