Having the ICC Spread the Word

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CMS directed SDS to include care coordination with cost cap. ISW cost limit: \$19,285 – "baseline" budget allocation.

Same eligibility as IDD Waiver , but targeted to those with less intensive needs

Cap of \$17,500/year. Up to \$5,000 in emergency funds every 3 years

Care Coordinator required, but cost doesn't count against the cap

Applications for ISW through registry

Serves up to 600 people

Most of the same services as IDD Waiver

Individualized Supports Waiver (ISW)

Helps people who use grant funds. Grant ends June 2018.

Person can decide how to use services up cap. Emergency funds for time limited additional need

Fewer required contacts for Care Coordinator than for the IDD Waiver.

Person can get ISW and stay on registry for IDD Waiver.

Major differences is ISW does not include out of home residential

Respite/Day Habilitation

In-home supports for ages < 18

Supported living for ages > 18

Intensive Active Treatment for Adults

Chore Services

Non-Medical Transportation

Supported employment (inc. pre-employment tasks)

New Waiver for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) who have been served on the grants.

Senior and Disabilities Ser

Individualized Supports Waiver Rollout

People on grants have been notified that they must enroll in the DDRR SDS has been selecting people off DDRR and working with them to establish eligibility and develop Support Plans Anticipating that ISW services will start as soon as SDS has CFC approval and regulations are final

Grant funds available until June 2018 Care Coordinators certified for IDD can do ISW /LTSS-TCM (no separate certification)

Individualized Supports Waiver (ISW) Questions and Answers

Community First Choice (CFC)

Community First Choice Personal Care Services (CFC/PCS)

Person Centered Support Plan

Personal Emergency Response System (PERS)

Training for people to choose and manage CFC/PCS assistants

Could have Waiver and CFC

Targeted Case Management to develop & update plan, if not choosing Waiver

Maintenance and Acquisition of Skills training; supervision and cueing

Same eligibility as Nursing Facility Level of Care Waivers- ALI, APDD, CCMC and ICF/IID Waivers-IDD, ISW – and Behavioral Health if <21 or 65+

> Assessment for CFC is the Consumer Assessment Tool (CAT)

Expands upon current Plan of Care. Get a plan even if only on CFC

Also known as Lifeline (press button if help is needed)

Person can choose

Services can't duplicate

Care Coordinator develops Person Centered Support Plan

Can choose training to learn to be more independent in activities like bathing, cleaning the home, or shopping

1915k Option that will help Alaska get more federal dollars: Starting with PCS & PERS, but will expand



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Community First Choice Rollout

Waiver/PCS combo will be automatically enrolled (unless opt out)

Letters have gone out

PCS only who met LOC on last assessment will be reassessed


Letters going out soon

CMS approval received, awaiting final regulations, anticipate July 1 start

Must be in CFC to receive Personal Emergency Response System (Lifeline) All certified Care Coordinators can develop CFC Support Plan (no separate certification)


New Ways of Paying for Care Coordination

Added new Medicaid Option, Targeted Case Management (TCM), because some case management is outside a waiver
