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**Young Alaskans invited to show their superpowers in
"Healthy Heroes Bookmark Challenge"**

September 4, 2026, ANCHORAGE, Alaska — What does it mean to be a Health Hero? The Alaska Department of Health is inviting young Alaskans ages 3–18 to answer that question through art as part of the second annual bookmark challenge.

The statewide activity encourages children and teens to think creatively about the everyday choices that help them feel healthy, strong, safe and connected. That might mean eating colorful foods, staying active, getting enough sleep, helping others, spending time with people they care about or taking a moment to breathe through big feelings.

Every healthy choice is a superpower

Participants can choose any artistic medium to create an original bookmark showing what makes them a "Health Hero". One winning design from each age group will be professionally printed, with copies mailed to the winning schools. Winning artists will also receive an Amazon gift card for their classroom.

Last year, nearly 200 young Alaskans from communities across the state participated in the challenge. "It was wonderful to see the creativity of young Alaskans from communities across the state in last year's challenge," said Heidi Hedberg, Commissioner of the Alaska Department of Health. "I look forward to seeing how this year's participants bring the Health Hero theme to life and share what being healthy means to them. There are so many ways to make healthy choices every day, and I'm excited to see those choices reflected through their art."

How to participate

1. Download the Healthy Heroes Bookmark Challenge materials at ConnectionsForKids.alaska.gov
2. Create a bookmark showing what being a Health Hero means to you
3. Submit your artwork by **Oct. 9, 2026**, using one of the following options:
