To be a DSP, you must meet the following requirements:

- Must be 18 years or older.
- Successfully pass a background check.
- Be hired by a provider agency. The agency will help you:
 - Complete agency training requirements (examples include but are not limited to Critical Incident Report, CPR & First Aid, National Certification in Employment Services (NCES), and Restrictive Intervention)
 - o Follow all rules on delivering and documenting services.

What does a DSP do?

DSPs help Alaskans in their homes, community, and at their jobs. DSPs help people meet their specific goals on topics like:

- Mobility/Motor Skills
- Self-Care/Personal Living
- Communication
- Learning
- Self-Direction/Social Skills
- Economic Self-Sufficiency
- Vocational Skills
- Living Skills/Community Living

Sometimes this work requires helping with Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)

- Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)
- o Eating
- o Personal Hygiene (Bathing, Dressing, Hair, Shaving)
- o Toileting
- o Transfers (Example: from bed to a wheelchair)
- o Locomotion (moving around)
