Press Statement: **DHSS Hires Tammie Wilson as Policy Advisor** 

More Support Needed for Alaska's Children & Families

In the FY21 budget, Governor Mike Dunleavy has asked for a new Deputy Commissioner within the Alaska Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS) to oversee the Office of Children's Services (OCS) and the Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ), to give these vital divisions the support and attention they need to take care of Alaska's youth and families. This is an important step toward needed reform. However, to ensure progress can be made as soon as possible, Governor Dunleavy and DHSS Commissioner Adam Crum developed a policy advisor role in the DHSS Commissioner's office. This new policy advisor will be Tammie Wilson. She will act as a parent resource and help support family resiliency, by helping families navigate the child welfare system and by working with OCS on positive reform.

This step will help reform efforts, and strengthen the important work that DHSS does in partnership with families and communities to support the well-being of Alaska's children and youth.
