Special Disaster Rules for Accepting Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) Benefits for Hot Foods Purchases

Alaska was approved for a temporary waiver to assist residents impacted by the power outages, severe flooding, and displacements caused by the September 2022 storm.

Effective immediately through November 4, 2022, Alaska recipients of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits who live in the areas of Lower Yukon, Lower Kuskokwim, Bering Straits, and Kashunamiut may use their benefits to purchase "hot" or prepared foods at any retailer that accepts EBT cards. This does not include restaurants or other non-EBT authorized retailers.

These special rules are in effect through November 4, 2022.

When hot foods are purchased with SNAP EBT benefits through November 4, 2022, the purchases are NOT subject to sales tax.

SNAP benefits may not be used to purchase alcohol or tobacco.
