7 AAC 41.310(c) is amended to read:

(c) During the family's eligibility period,

(1) if a parent experiences a non-temporary <u>cessation of an eligible activity of a</u>

job, [JOB LOSS OR ENDS PARTICIPATION IN A] job training or educational program, the family will continue to receive program benefits at the same level for a period of three months for the parent to engage in job search activities. The family's program benefits will end after the three-month period of job search activities, unless the parent has resumed work or is attending a job training or educational program; [.]

(2) if the parent experiences an absence from their eligible activity, there is no time limit for that absence if the family will be returning to an eligible activity with verification. A family must be participating in an eligible activity at the time of their next application.

7 AAC 41.335(a) is amended to read:

(a) To determine the amount the family must contribute toward the eligible cost of care, the department will or a designee shall use the department's Family Income and Contribution Schedule, revised as of <u>February 21, 2022</u>, [AUGUST 31, 2018,] and adopted by reference. This amount will be based on family size and income level, and on a sliding fee scale.
