## Non-Commercial Boating Fatalities in Alaska:

9 out of 10 are adult males

9 out of 10 in open boats <26 ft

3 out of 4 involve power boats

50/50 fresh and salt water

5 of 6 boating fatalities are a result of a vessel capsize, swamping, ejection, or fall overboard. 13.8% Female 86.1% Male Average Age: 42

47.5% Resident 13.9% Non-Resident 38.6% Unknown

66% motorized/ skiffs 34% non motorized/ canoes, kayaks

Deadly Months: April, June, July, August, September

#### Alaska Trauma Data 2008-2014

20% Female 72% Male

Average Age: 45

75% Resident 25% Non-Resident

79% Blunt Trauma

3% Burns


4% Cold Injury




