Alaska Public Health Alert

Updated Procedures for Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Testing in Alaska March 21, 2020

Summary

The purpose of this alert is to update Alaska health care providers about new procedures and strategies for managing COVID-19 testing in Alaska given the ongoing global and national COVID-19 outbreak.

Key Points

- Testing supplies are running low nationwide. Until this shortage is addressed, health care providers should prioritize testing to specific groups as per the updated table below.
- The Alaska State Public Health Laboratory (ASPHL) is running specimens 7 days a week.
 - STAT testing is generally not being offered.
- CDC guidance for discontinuation of home isolation for persons with COVID-19, available here.
- ONLY a nasopharyngeal swab is needed for testing. Further CDC testing guidance is available here.
 - o Providers <u>must</u> fill out a <u>COVID-19 Report Form</u> for each patient, regardless of the testing lab.
- Health care providers do not need to call the Alaska Section of Epidemiology (SOE) to approve testing.
- Advise all persons who have travelled out-of-state in the past 14 days to adhere to the social distancing guidance in the Alaska COVID-19 Out of State Travel Alert.
- SOE guidance on what outpatients should do if they have COVID-19 is available here.
- FDA guidance on specimen transport media and swabs is available <u>here</u>.
- Call SOE at **907-269-8000** or **800-478-0084** (after-hours) regarding outpatients who will not be able to isolate in their own homes (e.g., homeless persons or travelers from out of town).

Testing

Patients who have a <u>clinically compatible illness</u> (e.g., fever, cough, or shortness of breath) AND at least one of the following criteria should be considered for testing:
