



# Vaccine Preventable Diseases and Infection Prevention with Dr. John Lynch, MD, MPH



Dr. Lynch will be discussing important infection control issues related to vaccine-preventable diseases (such as measles and mumps), with an emphasis on practical considerations. He'll review important considerations when the provider is first considering a VPD as the diagnosis, what to do with suspect and confirmed cases, and issues of employee health related to VPDs. Dr. John Lynch is an infectious disease specialist in Seattle, Washington and is affiliated with Harborview Medical Center. His focus is on the prevention of healthcare associated infections (HAI), rational use of antimicrobials and employee health at Harborview Medical Center. In addition, he is an attending physician in HMC Infectious Diseases Clinic where he sees patients with a broad spectrum of infectious diseases.
