

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Alaska Facts and Figures



Summary:

-Overdose mortality was lowest in 2010, however, 2016 data show rates have increased since then.

-All opioids and Heroin or Fentanyl opioid overdose mortality rates show an increase since 2010.

-Prescription opioid overdose rates have been relatively steady since 2011.

-Note that the categories shown overlap, for example prescription opioid overdoses include those from methadone. Further, an overdose death could be due to a prescription and heroin or Fentanyl, and that death would be counted in both categories.

*Rates base on fewer than 20 occurrences are statistically unreliable and should be used with caution **Rates based on fewer than 6 occurrences are not reported. 1. ICD-10 Codes (as coded in the International Classification of Diseases, 10th Revision); Drug overdose deaths, defined as those with underlying cause of death as: Unintentional drug poisoning (X40-44), Suicide drug poisoning (X60-64), Homicide drug poisoning (X85), and drug poisoning of undetermined intent (Y10-Y14), Opioid overdose deaths are overdose deaths that also had a contributory cause of death as opium (T40.0), heroin (T40.1), natural and semisynthetic opioids (T40.2), methadone (T40.3), synthetic opioid other than methadone (T40.4) or other and unspecified narcotics (T40.6), Heroin & Fentanyl: T40.1 and/or T40.4 and literal text containing "Fentanyl" or analogues. Opioid Prescription: T40.2-T40.3 Recent deaths may not have final ICD-10 cause of death coding; any death with opioid related substances in cause of death, significant conditions and injury descriptions fields on the death certificate are counted here.

2. All rates are per 100,000. Age-adjusted (AA) rates are per 100,000 adjusted to U.S. year 2000 standard.
