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Definitions and Use of Race in this Report

Rates for Whites and Natives are used in this report. These two racial groups make up approximately 91 percent of the population of the state of Alaska during the period 1996-2004 (74 and 17 percent individually). The remaining 9 percent are Asian/Pacific Islander and Blacks (5 and 4 percent individually). Cancer rates for Whites and Natives are the most stable for the comparisons between races because of their larger numbers. Cancer rates for the other races tend to have larger fluctuations from year to year.

AK White: Caucasians in Alaska.

<u>AK Native</u>: Alaska Natives in Alaska. This includes a small population of Native Americans. <u>U.S. White</u>: Caucasians, including those living in Alaska, covered by the 13 registries of the U.S. SEER program of the National Cancer Institute.

<u>U.S. Native</u>: Native Americans and Alaska Natives, including those living in Alaska, covered by the 13 registries of the U.S. SEER program of the National Cancer Institute.

<u>Incidence Rate</u>: Rate of occurrence of NEW cancer cases diagnosed in a defined population in a given time frame.

<u>Mortality Rate</u>: Rate of cancer deaths occurring in a defined population during a given time frame.

<u>Crude Rate</u>: The number of new cases of cancer, or cancer deaths, during the year expressed as a rate per 100,000 persons in the population, without regard to the age distribution of the population.

<u>Age-Adjusted Rate</u>: Since cancer rates tend to vary with age, and populations vary with respect to their age-distribution, incidence and mortality rates are age-adjusted to allow comparison of rates between different populations with different age distributions. In this report, age-adjusted rates are calculated by the direct method using the age distribution of the 2000 United States standard population with 19 age groups. All age-adjusted rates are expressed per 100,000 individuals per year.

<u>U.S. Rate</u>: Age-adjusted rate for the population covered by the SEER program of the National Cancer Institute. The 13 SEER registries cover approximately 14 percent of the U.S. population, including Alaska (source: http://seer.cancer.gov/registries/data.html).

Introduction

This report presents a summary of cancer incidence and mortality for the 9-year period of 1996 to 2004 for the State of Alaska. The information is presented in a series of tables, graphs, and maps.

Incidence and mortality rates for the six highest-ranking cancers in Alaska are presented in tables and are ranked by both age-adjusted rates and by the number of cases during this time period. Rankings are presented for the state population as a whole as well as for Whites and Alaska Natives. Alaska rates are compared to U.S. rates. Incidence and Mortality pie charts illustrate the cancer types greater than 1 percent of the total. Graphs illustrate incidence and mortality trends for the six highest-ranking cancers by diagnosis year and death year for Alaska and the U.S. Rates for childhood cancer incidence and mortality are also presented. Color-coded maps illustrate ranges of incidence and mortality rates for the six highest-ranking cancers in Alaska for each borough/census area.

Causes of Cancer

It is not easy to explain why one person develops cancer and another does not. However, more research is showing that certain risk factors increase the chance that a person will develop cancer and most types of cancers become more common as we get older. The table below identifies established causes of cancer and the percentage of cancer deaths that are attributed to the specific risk factor. Many of the risk factors are preventable by lifestyle choices.

Incidence and Mortality Graphs


The next several pages consist of graphs illustrating cancer incidence and mortality in Alaska for the nine-year period 1996-2004. Rates are per 100,000 people and age-adjusted to the year 2000 U.S. Standard Population. Rates based on fewer than 20 occurrences are statistically unreliable and should be used with caution. Data are suppressed if the number of cancer cases is less than 6 for confidentiality purposes.

The percentage of incidence and mortality cases for all types of cancers greater than 2 percent of the total are presented as pie charts.

Rate trends by year for the six highest-ranking cancers in Alaska compared to the U.S. are presented as line graphs. The trend data for Alaska shows a larger variation than the U.S. data. This is due to the size of Alaska's population. The state has a relative small population and consequently, the number of cancer cases is relatively small, confidence intervals are wider, and the statistical variation from year to year is higher.


Rates stratified by race (White, Black, Native, and Asian & Pacific Islander) for the six highestranking cancers in Alaska compared to the U.S. are presented as bar graphs. It is not practical to illustrate yearly rate trends by race due to the small number of cases for individual race categories.

Rates for childhood cancer incidence and mortality in Alaska compared to the U.S. are presented in bar graphs. The number of these cases is relatively low – even over a 9-year period, some cancer rates are suppressed because there are less than 6 cases.




Malignant Cancer Incidence in Alaska, 1996-2004






All Sites - Malignant Cancer Incidence, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Prostate Cancer Incidence, AK and US Rates 1996-2004

Lung Cancer Incidence, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Colorectal Cancer Incidence, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Bladder Cancer Incidence, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma Incidence, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Malignant Uterine Cancer Incidence, AK vs US Rates 1996-2004









Prostate Cancer Incidence by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004











Colorectal Cancer Incidence by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Bladder Cancer Incidence by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma Incidence by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004






Female Breast Cancer Mortality, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Prostate Cancer Mortality, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Colorectal Cancer Mortality, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Pancreas Cancer Mortality, AK and US Rates 1996-2004








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


All Sites - Cancer Mortality by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004






Female Breast Cancer Incidence by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Prostate Cancer Mortality by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004


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Colorectal Cancer Mortality by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Pancreas Cancer Mortality by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004




Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma Mortality by Race, AK and US Rates 1996-2004


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Ovarian Cancer Mortality by Race 1996-2004




Incidence and Mortality Maps

The next several pages consist of color-coded maps of incidence and mortality rates for the highest ranking six cancers in Alaska for each borough/census area. The color scheme is gradational between red (high rates) and blue (low rates). Blank regions on the map represent areas in which cancer rates were not calculated because there were 5 or fewer cancer cases (or none) in that borough/census area. Numbers in the legend indicate the range of rates (up to but not including the upper value) represented by a specific color, and the numbers in parentheses indicate the number of borough/census areas in that range. Rate ranges are in equal intervals (for example, 10-15, 15-20, 20-25, etc.) except when the minimum or maximum value within a data set is much less than or much greater than the majority of the other values. In these situations, the lower or upper range has been extended to accommodate this outlying value. Rates are per 100,000 people and age-adjusted to the year 2000 U.S. Standard Population.


Note that borough/census areas with low populations may have unusually low or high cancer rates. In these situations, the rate may be a result of chance variations within the population rather than a true representation of the burden of cancer. For example, a low-population area may have 5 cases of a certain type of cancer for a given year, and 10 cases the next. If the population is 10,000, then the rate (per 100,000 people) is 50 the first year and 100 the next – a 100% variation. However, a high-population area may have 50 cases of the same type of cancer and 55 cases the next. If the population is 100,000, then the rate (per 100,000 people) is 50 the first year and 50 the first year and 55 the next – only a 10% variation. In both situations, the number of cases differing year to year is the same.




Map of Alaska with Boroughs and Census Areas




All Sites - Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Prostate Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Female Breast Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Lung Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Colorectal Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Bladder Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Uterine Cancer Incidence Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Total Cancer Mortality Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Lung & Bronchus Cancer Mortality Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Female Breast Cancer Mortality Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Prostate Cancer Mortality Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004




Colorectal Cancer Mortality Rates by Borough/Census Area, 1996-2004

Data Sources
