

Your child has Arctic Variant of CPT1A



What you need to know:

- If your child is healthy and eating normally, it is very unlikely he/she will have any problems with Arctic Variant CPT1A.
- Babies sometimes have problems with Arctic Variant CPT1A when they get sick, especially if they go more than 6-8 hours without breast or bottle feeding.
- If your baby is sick with cold/flu and cannot eat for 6-8 hours, contact your health care provider to have your baby seen in the clinic
- If your baby is too sleepy to eat or has a seizure, he/she needs to be evaluated by a health care provider immediately.
- If your baby has to go to the hospital or clinic because he/she is very sick, make sure to tell your provider he/she has Arctic Variant of CPT1A
- If your baby has Arctic Variant CPT1A and needs surgery, you should tell the surgeon before the surgery that your baby has Arctic Variant of CPT1A
