The Automated Service Plan (ASP) project began a couple of years ago when SDS staff began planning how to enhance our current data system, DS3, to better meet our programmatic needs. After completing our think-out-of-the-box planning phase, we requested and received support from the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

For the past few months we have been in the procurement process of engaging a contractor to help bring our vision to reality. SDS is intending to use Harmony Information Systems to implement the ASP project. As part of our research, SDS staff went to review the Massachusetts data system last month. Massachusetts uses Harmony Information Systems' products to manage their Long Term Care and Home and Community Based programs.
