

Education, belief in science, and a romantic view of humanity.




RESPONSES TO DISABILITY:

with the industrial revolution of the 18th entirely, more and more people floodical indi-cities, working for extremely low wages and living in squalid conditions. Children represented a large portion of the work force, performing grueling work for twelve to sixteen hours per day. Pauper children were often contracted to factory owners for cheap labor. To get rid of "imbecile" children, parish authorities often bargained with factory owners to take one "imbecile" with every twenty children. In most cases, these children disappeared mysteriously.



INVOLVEMENT BY PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES:

People become objects of study, are used in experiments, and assume the role of "patients."
